**SECOND SUPPLEMENT TO**  
**STATE’S RESPONSE TO DEFENDANT RONALD BRENT SWADLEY’S BRIEF**  
**REGARDING APPEAL BOND**

COMES NOW the State of Oklahoma by Gentner Drummond, Attorney General for the State of Oklahoma, and provides this Second Supplement to its Response to defendant Swadley’s Brief Regarding Appeal Bond as follows:

**Evidence of the Defendant’s Character from Jail Calls**

As noted in the State’s First Supplement, the defendant cites to *Gillespie v. State*, 1960 OK CR 67, ¶17, 335 P.2d 451 (1960) in his Brief Regarding Appeal Bond and asserts that evidence of Swadley’s “previous character” be considered by the Court. Following the filing of the State’s First Supplement, the State discovered calls made by the defendant while in the Oklahoma County Detention Center that this Court should also consider in determining whether to grant the defendant an appeal bond. A copy of the defendant’s recorded calls will be provided to the Court, and the State will admit a copy of the defendant’s recorded calls into evidence at the June 4, 2026 appeal bond hearing.

As evidenced by excerpts from the calls noted below, the State asserts that this defendant’s statements indicate a continued belief and desire that he should be treated differently than other defendants who have been found guilty of committing multiple felony offenses. The defendant

expresses his desire to improperly influence this case through the defendant’s perceived political connections including repeated references to Governor Stitt. He also expresses a willingness to leave the United States, and encouragement to “go to the extreme, and don’t be afraid of the consequences.” Relevant statements by the defendant revealing his attitude toward this case, the jury trial process, the court, and the pending appeal process include:

We, I promise you, are doing everything physically possible, I promise you that.”</p> <p><u>Brent Swadley</u>: “Okay, don’t rely on Peter and David and them...”</p> <p><u>Melanie Swadley</u>: “We’re not.”</p> <p><u>Brent Swadley</u>: “They don’t feel good about tomorrow. I mean I met with Peter this morning, he’s great, they are working hard, but they are like, there’s two people in the way of me getting fair justice, and...”</p> <p><u>Melanie Swadley</u>: “I know. They are both running for office”</p> <p><u>Brent Swadley</u>: “Well...”</p> <p><u>Melanie Swadley</u>: “It’s a political game”</p> <p><u>Brent Swadley</u>: “I don’t deal with him.”</p> <p><u>Melanie Swadley</u>: “One of them. Well one of the other is”</p> <p><u>Brent Swadley</u>: “And I’m talking about him and her”</p> <p><u>Melanie Swadley</u>: “I know, ‘the her’ is running”</p> <p><u>Brent Swadley</u>: “Right”</p>

**Conclusion**

In addition to the information provided in the State’s First Supplement, these calls are relevant for the Court to consider in determining whether to grant the defendant an appeal bond.

**WHEREFORE**, based on the prior and current character of the defendant together with the argument and authority previously provided, the State respectfully urges this Court to exercise

proper discretion, follow the presumption against granting an appeal bond, and deny the defendant's request for an appeal bond.


