John Wheeler, negro porter, First National bank. Killed while on his way to work Wednesday morning. He was struck by a stray bullet and killed instantly.

William Turner, 35, shot through abdomen; died at Morningside hospital last night.

George Jeffery or Jefferies, 36; shot through abdomen; died in Morningside hospital last night.

Slegg Alexander, 26; shot in back; died at Morningside hospital last night.
